Re: SBA Tribal Consultation on 8(a) Business Development Program and Mentor-Protégé Program Issues and Best Practices

Dear Assistant Administrator Cullo:

On behalf of the undersigned Tribal organization members of the Coalition for Tribal Sovereignty (CTS),<sup>1</sup> we write to acknowledge the Small Business Administration's (SBA) effort to engage in Tribal consultation on issues and best practices associated with the 8(a) Business Development Program and the Mentor-Protégé Program. However, we note that SBA is holding only one session, which is taking place in Alaska on June 13th. Given the importance of these programs, recent equal protection litigation related to the 8(a) Program that does not apply to Tribal Nations or Native owned businesses, and the critical role SBA plays in Indian Country more generally, we respectfully request that SBA schedule additional Tribal consultation sessions in several regional locations in the lower 48 states on these topics. We also ask that SBA hold Tribal consultations on the Entrepreneurial Development and Capital Access Programs. We are confident that additional government-to-government dialogue on these matters will be beneficial to the continued partnership between SBA and Indian Country, including Tribal Nations, Tribal citizens and communities, and Native owned businesses. SBA's programs are integral to the ongoing economic development in Indian Country.

Thank you for your consideration of this request, and we look forward to additional opportunities for dialogue in the near future.
